Satire Defined: Sarcasm, irony or wit used to ridicule or mock - poke fun of something serious. Satire Classified: Satirical Devices: 1. Irony—the actual intent is expressed in words which carry the opposite meaning. It is lighter, less harsh in wording than sarcasm, though more cutting because of its indirectness.
